

What have we been doing towards the Investors in Pupils award?

Individual Target Setting

The classes wrote mission statements (class rules) summarising the class ethos and covering the 5 elements of Investors in Pupils. They are displayed in classrooms on the Investors in Pupils display for children to follow.



Class Mission Statement

Children throughout school have been setting individual targets with their class teacher and working hard to achieve them! These targets will be reviewed at the end of this term and if your child achieves their target they will receive a certificate to bring home. They will then set themselves a new challenge for the forthcoming term.

Class Targets

Each class has been working very hard to achieve their whole class target and earn their reward. This has helped the children understand what to do in class and take responsibility for their learning, behaviour and progress.

Year 3 is the first class to achieve their class target of coming into the classroom quietly. They have celebrated with a teddy bears picnic!

Improving Our Attendance

To encourage everyone to make sure they attend school we have some new attendance rewards. Each child who attends school for whole week earns a golden raffle ticket and is entered into a prize draw (with family prizes). A winner will be pulled out at the end of this half term! Also, each class has the opportunity to win the highest attendance of the week trophy or a runners-up trophy. Classes from Y1-6 have their attendance monitored weekly and shared in mentions assembly.

Classes earn a:

- Golden apple for 100% attendance + highest attendance trophy
- Red apple for highest attendance + runners-up trophy
- Green leaf for 2nd highest attendance
- Orange leaf for 3rd highest attendance

Classes can then proudly display their attendance achievements on their class branch on the Attendance Tree in the school hall.



New Class Buddies and School Councillors

Years 1 to 6 have all now elected two class buddies, one boy and girl. The class buddies have been working hard to support their friends in class, cheer others up when they are feeling down and try to be a positive role model to others.

Children in Key Stage Two now have the opportunity to be on the School Council for more than one year! Each year 4 children are elected, two will stay on School Council for a Year and two children will become Permanent School Councillors and stay on the School Council from Year 3 - 6.
